Pass the Crayon uses art to create a space for all children to grow their social and emotional skills regardless of race or country of origin. Through creative group activities, Pass the Crayon helps build self-confidence, self-awareness, and interpersonal skills needed for refugee children, newly arrived migrants and German children to all live together in an integrated society.

Pass the Crayon believes in stimulating the creativity innate in all children. We hope to assist them in overcoming life challenges while they integrate as full members of the German society.

Pass the Crayon seeks to develop skills in children that lend themselves to positive self-expression and openness to relationships. Using art as a means of self-discovery, children of all backgrounds reveal their talents and utilize their strengths.

Pass the Crayon trains artists to work with different segments of German society, from refugees to the underprivileged addressing issues of integration to inequality while giving children a way to grow in a fun and safe environment. Our workshops are integrated with creative and imaginative play so young participants can express different concerns and feelings through art and interactive play.









As a child,
Martin dreamed
of becoming an
inventor. He created 1987
funny and useful
objects that made everyday life
better. Art has become a vehicle
of self-expression since he
needs more than one way to
communicate his ideas.

As an adult, he still sees things with his child's eyes and this is what brought him to create workshops for and with children. He believes that by mixing various creative activities with the intersection of interesting talented people, Pass The Crayon is able to create a safe space that is very significant in the lives of children. In this space, children grow in discovery and acceptance of themselves and others.

Sevin, a Kurdish woman who grew Özdemir up in Switzerland, Geneva remembers always 1984 finding refuge in creative activities organized by associations in her neighborhood.

As an adult, she realizes how great an impact these places have had on her development as well as her growth in empathy and openness to the world and its people. Sevin has never stopped drawing or making things and she knows that she will never let her inner child die, even when confronted with a more conformist and serious environment. Today, she wants to share art and life skills with the children because she understands what many of these children have encountered and desires to inspire many to be secure in who they are.


